Curriculum Information

Ash Class, Summer Term 2018- Hot and Cold



Communication, Language and Literacy/ English

This term we will focus on the text 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jefferies. The children will retell the story both verbally and through their writing and then write their own versions. We will also study the characters in the book. We will then use this as a basis to write information texts about Penguins. In contrast to this we will then look at Lions or Tigers using a variety of non-fiction sources. In addition to this, we will continue to have daily phonics, handwriting and reading sessions.

Mathematics

FS- We will be counting and recognising numbers to 20 and beyond, adding and subtracting, solving problems using doubling, halving and sharing. Creating own repeating patterns. Telling the time to o'clock and naming the days of the week in order.

Yr1- Pupils will be multiplying and dividing using knowledge of 2s, 5s and 10s. Fractions, position and direction. Place value, money and time. Telling the time to o'clock and half past and knowing the days of the week and months of the year.

Understanding the World/Geography-

In Geography we will use maps, atlases, globes and aerial views to name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.

We will identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. We will use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans.

RE

This term in RE we will focus on 'Creation'. We will explore what this means and how it links to Christian beliefs.

This learning will be focused around the question 'Why is the word God so important to Christians?'

Understanding the world/Science

In Science this term we will look at Animals and their habitats. The children will learn about a variety of habitats and the plants and animals that live there. They learn to tell the difference between things that are living, dead and things that have never been alive. They make observations of a local habitat and the creatures that live there, investigating conditions in local microhabitats and how they affect the minibeasts found within them.



Art & DT: Clay sculptures and Habitat dioramas.

Music: Our World – we will be exploring pitch, rhythm and instruments; learning and performing nursery rhymes and songs related to animals, minibeasts and the world around us.

PE: Games and Gymnastics, PE will be on a Tuesday and Thursday. Then swimming from just before May half term.

PSHE: The children will explore leading a healthy lifestyle by looking at how amazing our bodies are, some of the things our bodies can do and how to look after our bodies by following basic hygiene procedures.

Computing: Children will become confident using computer skills including logging on and off the computers, using a range of ICT, choosing and completing a simple program and learning how we can use the internet to find out information.
