English

History & Geography

Take some pictures of your family. Can you bring them in to share? Can you find out some interesting facts about your family? Maybe someone who lived a long time ago. Talk to them about how things have changed.

Draw/make a map of your village showing where the main landmarks are – can you draw a key for your map?

Which shapes can you see around you? Can you take photos of the shapes you find? Present them as a poster to share with the class.
