

## Daily Tasks- ELM- Year 1 & 2

With so many resources out there, we wanted to provide you with a simple, suggested list of 'learning tasks' that you should try and complete each day with your child/ children to ensure they continue to learn and build on the skills they have recently gained. These should fit in with our suggested timetable.

Please do also spend some time looking through the resources we have uploaded to our class web pages, to familiarise yourself with what is available to you and how you could use them.

Each day aim to spend time on:

<b>Subject:</b>	<b>Suggestions:</b>
Reading	Phonic based reading book, Oxford Owls online, share a story, read a comic, spot the words you know in any text.
Phonics	<p>Play phonics play, practice digraphs (see downloadable phonics mats), practice phase 4 and 5 tricky words. Read and write words containing known phonemes and digraphs, include a mix of real and alien words.</p> <p>Children should practice all phase 5 digraphs and split vowel digraphs. The children should look at how digraphs can be spelt differently but sound the same for example; ai, ay.</p>
Handwriting	The children are to pick 3 spellings from the Year 1 & 2 Common exception word lists each day. The children are to practice their letter formation and spelling through this task.
Writing	Twinkl home learning pack, keep a diary, write sentences to practice phonic skills. Retell a favourite story. Talk about capital letters, full stops and finger spaces (year 1). Focus on extending sentences and varying sentence types (year 2 )
Maths	<p>Mathletics, Twinkl home learning pack activities.</p> <p>Each week/day you could have a different focus for Maths</p> <p>Year 1-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Count in 2s, 5s and 10s</li> <li>2) Count forwards and backwards, up to 100</li> <li>3) Read and write numerals to 100</li> <li>4) Add and subtract one digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero</li> <li>5) Tell the time to the hour and half past the hour.</li> <li>6) Recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years</li> </ol> <p>Year 2-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Count in 2s, 5s and 10s</li> <li>2) Learn 3, 5 and 7 times tables.</li> <li>3) Add and subtract 2 digit numbers bridging the tens.</li> </ol>

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>4) Tell the time to the hour, half past the hour, quarter past and quarter too. Challenge: to the nearest 5 minutes.</li><li>5) Properties of shapes.</li><li>6) Fractions ( Halves and quarters)</li></ol>
