This menu details a range of fun activities including Oracy activities that can be completed at home to extend your child's learning. Please help your child to choose and complete a selection of these activities. To fit in with your family life, they can be completed after school, at weekends or as a half-term project. If you would like further suggestions, please feel free to select from the homework menus of other classes which are all available on the school website. Children are asked to share at least one of the activities with us in school. **The deadline for this homework is Wednesday 10th June** and we ask that the homework is not brought into class until after half-term.

English

Compare a mammoth to an elephant—what's the same and different?

Hide a piece of paper at home and write clues for someone to find it.

Talk about your favourite place to go. Why do you love it? Can you convince other people to visit it too?

Create your own superhero and write their name, power, and a short description.

Science.

Can you plant seeds at home (in a garden or outside) and see what happens? How can you help them to grow?

Visit a beautiful garden with your family and draw and describe it.

Repurpose something that you have finished with to make something else.

Collect or look at flowers and sort them into garden or wild flowers.

Art & DT

Find and rub textures such as brick, wood, and stone using crayons.

Build a house using junk materials.

Make a pinch pot using playdough.

Design and make your own smoothie. Tell us how to make it and if you enjoyed it.

History & Geography

If you visit a beach, draw or write about what you see there.

Choose a creature we might find at the beach and write some facts about it.

Can you create a beach from Lego or junk modelling?

Can you create your own aeroplane? What will you use to make it?

Create a fact file or picture of The Wright Brothers or Amelia Earhart.

Mathematics

Can you make or bake something using scales to weigh out the ingredients?

Ask 5 people their favourite fruit and make a tally chart or a bar chart.

Start to look at the clock to see the times each hour and, if confident, to the half hour.

Keep a record of how long it takes you to get ready everyday. Is everyday the same?

RE

Draw something that is precious to you. Can you explain why it is special to you?

Read a story that is important to people of faith and think about it. What could you learn from it?

Read a story that is special to you. Why is it your favourite? What do you love about it?

Make a paper scroll and write/draw an important message for people today.
