English

Write a recount of something you have done at the weekend or a special visit you have had over the holidays.

Find a story with patterned (repeated) language to share with your class.

Write a poem about your favourite animal.

Write a list of what you would take on holiday with you.

Can you track the weather over a week?

What are the temperatures?

Can you draw a picture of the changes you have seen?

Can you record the different phases of the moon?

RE

Draw/paint or create a picture of the Creation story for Christianity and Islam.

Write a prayer to say thank you for all the animals in creation.

Write a recount of part or all of the Christmas story and illustrate it.

Write a prayer to say thank you for things that have happened to you this year.

History & Geography

Speak to your parents and grandparents or other members of your family about what their childhoods were like. Find out how they were different to yours.

You could interview them and share your recording at school.

Could you bring in a photograph showing how life was different?

Draw a map of your village showing where the main landmarks are – can you draw a key for your map?

Can you investigate and then draw your family tree?
